'Young people are providing peer-to-peer support to students transitioning from primary school to high school, thanks to Co-op Foundation funding'.

Salford Foundation will build on the fantastic work LEAP has delivered over the past 18 months thanks to extra funding from the Co-op Foundation's #iwill Fund.

The project, which will run in Salford high schools is expected to support around 280 young people over the next 14 months. By the end of the project, we hope to have trained over 40 peer mentors to support their mentees in transitioning to high school, through sharing their experiences and skills.

Jason King, Salford Foundation, said:

'LEAP's continuation funding is a great opportunity to build on the work we have delivered. Having worked with hundreds of students already we're excited to help more students learn and develop new skills, give young people a voice in their communities and provide them with a platform to be able to make a difference.'

Today's funding has been made possible thanks to Co-op Foundation's £5 million #iwill Fund. This is a partnership between Co-op Foundation, the National Lottery Community Fund and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport to help young people get involved in social action activities, like fundraising or volunteering.

The Co-op Foundation has been awarding grants from its #iwill Fund since 2018. Its flexible funding is helping to build fairer and more co-operative communities to deliver on Co-op's vision 'Co-operating for a Fairer World'.

Nick Crofts, CEO of the Co-op Foundation, said:

"Our partnership with the #iwill Fund over the past four years has shown the positive impact of youth social action, which has the triple benefit of helping the young person taking part alongside their peers and the wider community. We're delighted to be extending #iwill funding so more young people can be empowered to make a difference."
