families and communities out of poverty

Elevate Salford is a Learning Skills and Work Partnership managed by Salford CVS and delivered by VCSE organisations including Salford Foundation. The partnership aims to work together to help a total of 1,500 unemployed adults and those in work wanting to develop their skills, to achieve their goals and move forward.

Support provided includes:
One to one practical information, advice and guidance to identify suitable careers, groupbased health and wellbeing activities, help in developing a bespoke action plan, training to develop new skills, offering volunteering opportunities, work placements, job search and preparation to access local employment opportunities.



Salford Foundation is a key delivery partner for Elevate Salford. We are on target to support 300 men and women over 3 years. Since January 2023 to June 2025, we have helped a total of 318 people move closer to work including:



228 bespoke action plans completed

20 people completed a volunteering or work placement opportunity

79 people starting paid work



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We help unemployed adults and those in work on low incomes experiencing financial hardships to understand what benefits they can claim, how to maximise their household income and reduce debt.

Nationwide currently supports our **Homeless Prevention** project for men in Salford. They have become the first UK financial provider to offer free benefits support over the phone in addition to online support. The service is open to **everyone** to use, not just its **own customers**.

2,229 households found they were eligible for over £550 a month on average since the calculator was launched in late June 2025. Click here <u>"Better Off"</u> benefits calculator.





Greater Manchester's Live Well programme is central to Andy Burnham's manifesto commitment to tackle health, social & economic inequalities and persistent barriers to Living Well in Greater Manchester neighbourhoods.

Programme partners include:

- · Greater Manchester Combined Authority (GMCA),
- Greater Manchester Integrated Care (NHS GM),
- Greater Manchester voluntary, community, faith and social enterprise sector (VCFSE) sector
- · Greater Manchester's 10 local authorities and communities

The model for GM Live Well consists of 4 key elements:

- 1. Live Well centres, spaces and offers
- 2. Neighbourhood model with multi-agency teams
- 3. Resilient and connected VCFSE Eco-system
- 4. Culture of prevention and person-centred approach

New Economic Inactivity Trailblazers were launched in 2025/26 across GM funded by the Department for Work and Pensions. £10m funding will be available for Trailblazer programmes to support those furthest from the labour market. As well as developing new ways to tackle unemployment using a placebased approach and building on the GM Working Well model. Watch out for further updates!

Our World of Work activity is designed to provide insight into different jobs and career pathways for young people and this all starts from a conversation with you!

As a **business volunteer**, you will engage in brief yet meaningful conversations with students about your identity, work, and career journey. These discussions can highlight available opportunities and offer insights into achievable paths after school, starting with GCSE selections.

Some of the things you might want to highlight through conversation or activity include:

- What is your job?
- What does the day-to-day look like?
- What do you do that is different to other roles in the business?
- Does it require specific qualifications?
- · Who is the company you work for?
- · What does the company do and how does your role fit in it?
- How did you get to where you are now?
- Are there any potential opportunities for young people at 16 or 18 years old?

What is payroll giving?

Payroll Giving, also known as GAYE (Give As You Earn) is a simple, taxefficient way for employees to donate to Salford Foundation directly from their salary. It's automatic, secure, and makes a lasting impact.

This means you get tax relief on your donations, as the donation is taken before tax is calculated on your income.

- Provides regular, long-term income streams – helping Salford Foundation plan more effectively for expenditure
- Removes the need to claim Gift Aid saving Salford Foundation valuable time and money
- If you pay the basic 20% tax rate and donate £10 each month, Salford Foundation will receive £10, but only £8 will be deducted from your net pay
