The social inclusion charity has been supported and assessed by Manchester Pride's All Equals Charter to strengthen its equality, diversity and inclusion practices.

Social inclusion charity, Salford Foundation, have achieved 'Good Practice' for the All Equals Charter, doing especially well in 'Services' and 'Progress Tracking and Reporting'.

The All Equals Charter is Manchester Pride's programme to help businesses and organisations understand, recognise and challenge any form of discrimination in the workplace. The charter aims to make the workplace inclusive, diverse and equal for marginalised people.

Salford Foundation initially set up an Equality, Diversity & Inclusion task group to refresh and agree a new action plan. Staff from across the charity met regularly and worked together to prepare for the assessment and provide supporting evidence.

Phil East, Chief Executive from Salford Foundation said: "Our commitment to Equality, Diversity and Inclusion is embedded within our core values at Salford Foundation. I'm delighted that we have achieved the All Equals Charter accreditation as part of continuous improvement.

"However, it's not the end of our journey. We will continue to strive harder and challenge ourselves to be a fully inclusive and diverse charity. I am grateful to all my colleagues for their commitment and dedication in enabling us to achieve this accreditation."

All Equals Charter members strive towards accreditation from Entry Level up to Role Model Level. The members are invited to follow a set of commitments and principles, they are then regularly assessed to ensure their workplace, services and company promotes and embeds equality and diversity for all members of marginalised communities.
