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Chief Executive's Message - Phil East

The 1st of April always feels more like the start of the year to me than the 1st of January. That's because it's often the point in time when we have new projects starting, correlating with the beginning of the financial year.

This April is no different, with at least 7 projects that are either brand new or renewed and slightly changed cont.....

Chief Executive's Message cont.....

This is fantastic news as it means that we can support more people to build better futures for themselves, their families and communities.

The biggest change this April is that we will be launching the 'Safe in Salford' partnership. We are leading a group of local charities who will collectively deliver domestic abuse support services in the city. We have been successful in a competitive tender process to launch the partnership, with funding from Salford City Council, the Clinical Commissioning Group and Greater Manchester Police. For us, this builds on the support we have given women experiencing domestic abuse through our Together Women Project for the past 15 years and more recently through our 'Indigo' project. This is also an exciting opportunity to work with other specialist charities who bring particular skills and experience. We will be working alongside Pankhurst Trust; Talk, Listen Change (TLC); and Trafford Domestic Abuse Service to deliver five distinct support projects. Initially, we will be doing this for the next 5 years.

Domestic abuse affects people from every background and every walk of life. Unfortunately, that will include people who you know through your business and your networks. As we get further into this work, we want to explore how companies can help us tackle domestic abuse and make Salford a safer place. News from The Shed

Since The Shed's service launched during covid in May 2020, we have supported 128 men aged 18+.



Mac's Story

Mac was referred to 'The Shed' by the Greater Manchester Mental Health Trust team. He was suffering from psychosis, loneliness and isolation. After an initial induction and assessment, an individual action planned was created and agreed with Mac. This plan included a list of 5 interventions that would enable Mac to move forward with a positive mindset.

It was highlighted that Mac was a trained barber and he offered to volunteer one morning a week doing free hair-cuts for other Shed beneficiaries.



To participate in a Shed Activity
 To attend weekly peer support sessions
 To update his current CV
 Receive financial support and advice
 Volunteer 2-3 hrs per week
 giving free haircuts to Shedders

To date, Mac has attended peer support sessions, he has received weekly shopping vouchers as well as meeting up with The Sheds Debt and Welfare Advisor where his current finances have been checked.

Moving forward, we are hoping that Mac continues to build up his resilience and confidence with a view to him returning to full time employment.




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Meet the Raising Aspirations Team

Find my Future in Construction



Salford Foundation depends on many corporate partners who work alongside us to provide skills, expertise, knowledge and time that is invaluable. Through our collaborative partnership with Driving Change, Kenny Waste Management is helping young people on the Find My Future course to understand construction employers expectations. With the support of <u>Kenny's Waste Management</u>, Trainees were lucky enough to be offered a visit to experience a live demolition by Connell Brothers Ltd.

The purpose of this experience was to give a very practical demonstration to young people on the course how a demolition site works, the planning and logistics involved in waste management. The visit included a tour of the site and an in-depth explanation of how much of the materials salvaged can be re-used and re-cycled, making a significant contribution to the environmental sustainability in the construction. sector.

The trainees were provided with a demo of how the machinery works and were amazed at the precision and skills employed by the operators.

'It was exciting to watch, we never realised that there is more to demolition than just knocking down a building'.

Find my Future is part-funded through The Prince's Trust, whose aim is to support young people aged 16-25 from disadvantaged and underprivileged backgrounds by enabling them to access employment, enterprise and training opportunities..
